SBDA

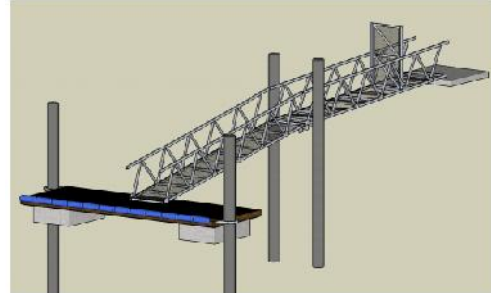
